City Areas



Exploring a city can be tricky if you don't know your way around, or even what to look out for. Get a flavour of Belfast with this taster to help navigate your way around the city's areas and quarters.



CITY CENTRE

Home to the iconic Belfast City Hall, St George's Market and the main shopping district. You'll be spoilt for choice with the abundance of cool cafés, great pubs, trendy bars and an amazing restaurant scene. Start off in the Visit Belfast Welcome Centre (opposite City Hall) to pick up information, book tours and find out everything to make the most of your time while studying in Belfast.



CATHEDRAL QUARTER

Packed full of fascinating architecture, buzzing beer gardens, trendy warehouse restaurants, cobblestoned streets, and colourful street art, this area of town contrasts the old with the new, with St. Anne's Square, home to the Metropolitan Arts Centre (MAC) and a piazza of welcoming eateries, alongside some of the oldest streets in Belfast.



LINEN QUARTER

Belfast was once nicknamed "Linenopolis" as it was the world leader in the production of linen in the 19th Century. Just south of City Hall, you can enjoy the architecture of the old linen mills which house a mix of offices, chic bars and renowned restaurants. This is a great part of town to enjoy dinner and drinks before a show at the Grand Opera House.



TITANIC QUARTER

Steeped in memories of a bygone era, the Titanic Quarter is now a fun and energetic urban waterfront development. Visit or take a tour of the many historic and state-of-the-art Titanic visitor attractions, or simply stroll around the Maritime Mile to learn more about the city's shipbuilding heritage.



QUEEN'S QUARTER

The area surrounding Queen's University is a treasure trove of eclectic shops. boutiques, cafés, affordable places to eat, bars and art galleries. Visit the collections of the Ulster Museum, sign up for a class in the Crescent Arts Centre, eniov world cinema at QFT, chill out in Botanic Gardens or take a jog along the banks of the River Lagan.



GAELTACHT QUARTER

The centre for Irish language, music and culture is in the west of the city. An Cultúrlann showcases cultural Irish Gaelic traditions and contains a restaurant. gift shop, theatre and gallery. Explore the stunning Clonard Monastery or enjoy the 3 mile Divis Summit Trail, a specifically designed loop walk on Divis Mountain with spectacular views over Belfast.



EAST SIDE

EastSide was once the beating heart of the city's industrial past with thousands of people employed in linen mills, rope factories, engineering works and shipyards. EastSide is now thriving once again but this time as a hub of culture and creativity. Make the EastSide Visitor Centre your first stop, with information on things to do in east Belfast.



THE SHANKILL

Straddling North and West Belfast, the Shankill is home to a wide collection of painted murals depicting the social and political history of the area. Places of interest include the Peace Wall, the Old Shankill Graveyard, dating back to the 14th century, the Shankill Memorial Park and the ancient Bullaun Stone. The Spectrum Centre, a major landmark in the area, hosts a range of events and exhibitions.

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Belfast packs a punch when it comes to high quality speciality coffee, with excellent baristas, funky interiors and, of course, an excellent cuppa, you'll be kick starting your day the right way.

What's more, many of these local gems stay open late, hosting everything from craft circles and acoustic music to regular board game nights, dishing up fabulous treats and keeping the caffeine flowing for late nights in the library! Here are a few of the best ones to check out:

CLEMENTS

One of the longest established locally-owned coffee chains, Clements is a firm favourite offering great coffee and tasty treats. They pride themselves on being passionate about the products they sell, and you can visit them at a number of locations across the city centre and Queen's Quarter including Queen's University's PEC, MBC, Elmwood Avenue and McClay Library and also The Mall at Ulster University.

ESTABLISHED COFFEE

Established was one of the first trailblazers on Belfast's coffee scene and is probably at the top of many a Belfast coffee lover's list. It's located in Belfast's trendy Cathedral Quarter and is a hipster's paradise, with industrial bare cement floors and walls and plenty of plug sockets to hook up your MacBook. Not only do they make amazing coffee, but the food is top notch also.

KAFFE O

Kaffe O brings a little Scandinavian charm to Belfast — as well as great coffee. This Nordic-inspired coffee house has branches on Botanic Avenue, Ormeau Road as well as their kiosk on Donegall Square North opposite Belfast City Hall. Their coveted blend is the reason for their success, which is imported from Ricco's Kaffe bars in Copenhagen.

GROUND ESPRESSO BARS

A local coffee chain which prides itself in maintaining a welcoming atmosphere producing excellent coffee, served with innovation in an ethical manner. In Belfast you'll find them at Victoria Square, Queen Street, Waterstones on Fountain Street and Next on Donegall Place.

DILLY AND DOLLY'S

Opened with the aim to be 'the most Instagrammable coffee shop in Ireland', Dilly and Dolly's has been stopping people in their tracks since they opened the doors on Ann Street. This pretty pink, quirky coffee shop is known for its delicious gelato, tasty coffees and treats that almost look too perfect to eat.

STARBUCKS

Found on street corners in cities across the globe, the green-aproned baristas have become the mascots of many people's morning routine. Concerned with



more than flavour, Starbucks strives to fill its menu with responsibly sourced coffee, cocoa and tea that protect the farmers and bioregions they come from.

GENERAL MERCHANTS

This relaxed local neighbourhood eatery serves fine coffee and Antipodean brunches with the finest and freshest locally sourced food daily. There are 5 locations to discover: Ormeau Road, Stranmillis, Forestside, East Belfast, and a new kiosk on Donegall Place in Belfast City Centre.

THE DOCK CAFÉ

The Dock Café is perhaps one of the most interesting and eclectic cafés in Belfast. Run by volunteers and based in the Titanic Quarter, it's an 'Honesty Box' café which means it doesn't charge for the food and drinks served; it simply asks for donations based on what you think your order is worth.

ROOT & BRANCH CAFÉ & ROASTERS

A roastery & brew bar on the Newtownards Road, it's a place for creativity, experimentation and regular new roasts. Most of all, it's a place where you can have a wonderful cup of coffee or buy some beans to bring home. They also offer a carefully curated programme of events designed to elevate your coffee experience.

GUILT TRIP

This destination coffee and donut shop is the brainchild of ex-Ulster Rugby stars, Callum Black and Darren Cave. Guilt Trip is one of the coolest coffee spots in town, serving aeropress, batch and some seriously tasty donuts. With two stores in Belfast to choose from, the East Belfast Original on Orangefield Lane or Southside on Lisburn Road, you can pre-order your donuts for pick-up.

DISTRICT

District is an independentlyowned coffee shop/deli serving fine coffee and great food on Stranmillis Road, Lisburn Road and Ormeau Road, with loads of vegan and vegetarian options. District uses local roaster, Bailies, with singleorigins served on espresso and pour-over through the V60.

THE POCKET

A small, humble establishment in the city centre located in the FlatIron Building on Upper Church Lane, serving high quality fresh food with a delicious brunch style menu. Enjoy great coffee, hot chocolate and iced teas in a chilled atmosphere.

LAMPPOST CAFÉ

For something a little bit different, check out this CS Lewis-themed café on the Newtownards Road. With a Narnia twist on tea shop decor, a ragtime soundtrack and everything served on vintage crockery, you will feel as though you have stepped back in time (or into the wardrobe!).

Ulster Museum

An inspiring piece of modern architecture set in the beautiful Botanic Gardens, the Ulster Museum is the largest museum in Northern Ireland and is free to visit. Impressive galleries and interactive discovery zones bring history, science and art collections to life and its unparalleled collection of Irish art is well worth seeing.

Galleries

Belfast has an impressive array of gallery spaces, displaying everything from the most contemporary visual art at the Golden Thread Gallery and contemporary photographic exhibitions at Belfast Exposed to the freshest modern art in The MAC. The Naughton Gallery at Queen's features a rolling programme of works from the University's own collection, touring exhibitions and shows by local and international artists and the Atypical Gallery is the only permanent exhibition space in Ireland dedicated specifically to highlighting the work of disabled and D/deaf artists.

Space Craft

Make a stop at the Fountain Centre where you'll find this lovely combination of shop and gallery, showcasing a range of ceramics, jewellery, sculptures, design items, fabrics, cards and art by local makers. The crafts exhibited change constantly and also showcase work by young, emerging artists.

The Bradley Gallery

Terry Bradley is probably one of the most recognisable and collectable artists working in Ireland today, so make a stop at his pop-up gallery on the ground floor of Victoria Square. terrybradley.com



The Murals

Once described as "the world's greatest open-air gallery", the murals of Belfast are a must-see experience. Artworks range from Republican and Loyalist political statements to colourful celebrations of the city's famous sons and daughters. The Peace Wall that divides two communities in West Belfast is home to a vibrant mix of political murals, graffiti and commissioned public art - stop by to add your own message of peace and hope.

Public Art

Belfast has over 150 pieces of distinctive public art scattered across the city. Highlights include the 'Big Fish' on Donegall Quay, whose scales are made up of ceramic tiles decorated with texts and images relating to the history of Belfast, while the biggest art sculpture in the city is 'Rise' - its concentric globes symbolising the rising sun and new hope for the city's future.

Linen Hall Library

Founded in 1788, the Linen Hall Library is the oldest library in Belfast and the last subscribing library in Ireland. It is renowned for its unparalleled Irish and Local Studies Collection and is a tranquil reading nook in the heart of the city.

Belfast is buzzing with cosy bars, craft beers and a vibrant live music scene. From up and coming talent playing in gigs across the city to toe-tapping traditional Irish sessions, you'll not be disappointed. **Many of the bars across the city offer live music but here's some of our favourites.**

THE LIMELIGHT Ormeau Ave

This establishment has two concert venues, Limelight 1 and 2 with a cosy Irish bar positioned between the two, Katy's Bar, with the popular rock beer garden on its roof. From small upcoming bands to headline acts, Limelight is a premier show venue with a tiny pub atmosphere, all year round.

THE EMPIRE Botanic Ave

This converted church has provided live music and comedy since 1987, and has the best atmosphere anywhere south of the city, every weekend. Friday nights are dedicated to new local musicians, from folk to rock; the Empire Bar has staged many stars in their beginning, including Two Door Cinema Club and General Fiasco.

PUG UGLYS Bedford St

Pug Uglys resident artists and guests bring you a mix of Traditional Irish Sessions, acoustic sounds and DJ sets.

MCHUGH'S Queen's Square

Located just across from Custom House Square, McHugh's Basement Bar truly is a hidden gem. With the same traditional feel as the main bar, the basement is often used as an intimate live music venue. Over the years it has hosted established artists such as Sea Sick Steve, Kodaline and more.

THE ERRIGLE INN Ormeau Rd

The very first bar in Belfast to receive an entertainments license, The Errigle has a great history for excellent music and atmosphere, and has earned its reputation for serving fabulous food, drink and entertainment. Belfast Botanic Gardens

This is a no brainer for students at Queen's. This beautiful park covers 28 acres and is right next to the McClay Library, near the main Lanyon Building. Home to the famous Palm House and Tropical Ravine, you'll also see a ton of people here on a sunny day out relaxing on the lawns. After all, what's better than a nice picnic or an ice cream with your flatmates when the sun is out?

Ormeau Park

Not far from the River Lagan, this is the oldest municipal park in the city. Popular with walkers and joggers with a parkrun every Saturday at 9.30am, there are a range of eco trails and orienteering routes as well as sports facilities, including soccer pitches, bowling greens, a BMX track, and basketball, tennis and netball courts.

Victoria Park

This is a truly lovely park with a lake, great walks, viewing points, jogging trails and plenty of birds and ducks. It's also a short walk to Titanic Quarter or CS Lewis Square in EastSide. There are two possible circuits of the park, an inner and outer loop around the lake. A great place for aviation enthusiasts who can watch the planes flying in and out of the neighbouring Belfast City Airport.

Divis & Black Mountain

Just 6 miles from Belfast, this is a popular spot to head to for those looking to escape the hustle and bustle of the city. There are two main trails and both have incredible views. The Summit Trail is a challenging 3 mile circular hike which takes at least 1.5 hours. The Ridge Trail is a moderate but longer 4.2 mile route taking at least 3 hours.

Cave Hill Country Park

Whether you've been a dozen times or yet to go, Cave Hill in North Belfast never disappoints. Starting from the car park at Belfast Castle, it's a straightforward circular 4.5 mile route that'll stretch the legs with great views to clear the head - and not too much effort getting there. It's easy to see why it's so popular.



Lagan Valley Regional Park

Explore an area of 4,200 acres, extending 11 miles along both sides of the River Lagan between Stranmillis, in South Belfast to Union Locks, Lisburn. The towpath is a tranquil spot for an easy, level walk or cycle with plenty of attractions to stop at on the way including the Lock Keepers Cottage, Shaw's Bridge, Malone House, the Giants Ring and Sir Thomas & Lady Dixon Park.

North Down Coastal Path

Hop on the train to Holywood to enjoy this gem in Northern Ireland's leisure offering. The section up to Bangor stretches 10 miles along rocky shores, fine sandy beaches, quiet coves, country parkland, busy promenades and moments of perfect isolation.

WORTH THE TRIP

Belfast is only just over an hour's drive away from the worldrenowned Giants Causeway, Northern Ireland's only UNESCO World Heritage Site. A geological wonder and home to a wealth of history and legend, the 40,000 basalt stone columns left by volcanic eruptions 60 million years ago intrigue and inspire everyone who visits.

The Mourne Mountains form the highest and most dramatic mountain range in Northern Ireland. With breathtaking views across the Irish Sea and an intricate map of weaving paths to explore, they are high on any keen hiker's to-do list. Starting from Donard car park it takes around 2½ hours to get to the top. Keep an eye on weather conditions and ensure you have the appropriate footwear, equipment, food and water for the day Throughout the year, Belfast celebrates different cultures and experiences with a wide range of events and festivals. So whether your passion's music, theatre, dance, film, comedy or experiencing something new, you'll find something to pencil into your diary!

SURVIVAL GUIDE:

ACCOMMODATION



Whether you are an undergrad or postgrad, and whether you want to live on campus or rent privately, there are a wide variety of accommodation choices open to students throughout the city. Queen's Accommodation offers options for students wishing to make a specific lifestyle choice, e.g. quiet living, no alcohol and single sex blocks, visit stayatqueens. com to help you get started. Ulster University provides apartment living in a modern student village full of facilities on the Jordanstown campus, and there are brand new ensuite rooms and apartments at 123 York Street beside the new Belfast campus. Visit ulster.ac.uk/accommodation for further details. Both universities have a residential team on hand to offer students support and promote a weekly programme of social events.

WEATHER/CLIMATE

There's no such thing as bad weather, only the wrong clothes! We might be more famous for our rainy skies and beautiful greenery than we are for our blazing sunshine but Belfast is a city with a moderate climate. The local climate is characterised by equability - bringing relatively mild winters and cool summers. July is the hottest month with an average temperature of 18°C (64°F) and the coldest is January at 4°C (39°F).

TRAVEL CARDS

Tickets for Translink services can be made using the mlink App. Make sure to register for your free ylink or 24+ student travel card and link it in the app to take advantage of discounted 1/3 off travel. Visit **translink.co.uk/ylink** to get started.

BANKING

As Northern Ireland is part of the UK, the local currency is GBP. If you need to change money or to open an account, you can do this online or drop into a city centre branch. Both QUB and UU offer help and advice with any aspect of student finance, along with guidance and advice on general money management such as how to live on a budget or how best to deal with your student debt. Check out your University's information online or call into the Students Union.

DISCOUNTS



Many local shops and service providers offer great student discounts on everything from clothing and gym memberships to haircuts. You can sign up to UNIDAYS, TOTUM and Student Beans online or as both QUB and UU are members of the National Union of Students, your student ID card functions as an NUS student card and entitles students to a wide range of deals and discounts across the city and beyond.



WHAT'S ON

There's normally plenty of activity happening in and around the Student Union. Check online for the frequently updated programme of events, QUB: **qubsu.org/WhatSOn** or UU: **uusu.org**. Visit Belfast's website also has plenty of information on ways to keep you entertained –from bars, restaurants, tours and fun things to do in and around the city. **visitbelfast.com**.

PLACES OF WORSHIP @

Chaplains and other religious representatives are appointed by the Universities to represent and serve students and staff. The chaplaincy centres provide a focus for worship, a range of social events and activities, groups for prayer or study, in addition to pastoral care and counselling. Currently, 12 faiths and denominations are represented at Queen's. Ulster University campuses in Belfast and Jordanstown have a prayer and meditation room.

PART-TIME WORK

Part-time work can be a useful way of earning money and developing skills which are valued by graduate recruiters at the same time. QUB offers an On-Campus JobShop which advertises part-time jobs available in QUB Schools and Departments. In addition the off-campus JobShop helps students locate work with employers external to the university. You can also keep an eye out for opportunities at local retailers, bars and restaurants – many look for additional staff in the run up to Christmas.

VOLUNTEERING



Student life is all about the experiences – or at least so we are told! While studving and partying may take up a lot of your time, making space for some voluntary work can really add value to your overall experience. Student volunteering is of course a great way to make a real contribution to a cause you feel strongly about, or it can give you the chance to participate in new experiences. MIND YOUR MOOD

If you're a 'uni newbie', you might be away from home for the first time – it's a big change, but there's loads of support services available to make that transition a little bit easier. You can reach out to the residential team at your accommodation, the student wellbeing team, your personal tutor or your peer mentor for help and support.

Once you get settled it can be a busy time, and stresses can mount up and really take their toll - so it's important to take the time to prioritise your own mental wellbeing.

Here's some tips that might help: get in a good sleep routine, be mindful of your environment, do something that you enjoy, cook or bake something tasty, make time for physical activity, listen to some music, decide who to spend time with and write a to-do list.

If you find yourself experiencing mental health difficulties which are preventing you from doing the things you want to do, seek help – whether through friends, family, a doctor, or your university support services.

WHICH SERVICE?

Metro – Bus services operating throughout the Belfast area. Metro and Glider tickets are interchangeable and can be used on both services.

Glider – A cross-city service, G1 runs between east and west Belfast and G2 runs between Belfast City Centre and Titanic Quarter. Glider and Metro tickets are interchangeable and can be used on both services.



Ulsterbus – Local bus services, serving all main towns and villages in Northern Ireland.

Goldline – Express coach services which link together the main towns and cities across Northern Ireland.

NI Railways / Enterprise – Rail Services across Northern Ireland and from Belfast to Dublin.

Airport Services –

Bus services from Europa Buscentre to airports in Belfast, Dublin and Derry~Londonderry.

UNI-LINK

The Belfast Uni-Link Service (U1 and U2) is a Metro service calling at Queen's University, Ulster University Belfast, Northern Regional College and Ulster University Jordanstown. Metro smart cards can be used on the Uni-Link bus service.

WHICH TICKET?

yLink Card

yLink is a free travelcard for all 16-23 years olds in Northern Ireland. You get 1/3 off all Translink bus and rail travel in Northern Ireland and up to 50% off Enterprise! Plus you also get discounts and offers from Translink partner business! *yLink holders should use a ticket vending machine to buy their discounted tickets before boarding Glider.

24+ Student Railcard

If you are 24 years of age or over and in full-time education you can get great savings on NI Railways with a massive 1/3 off single, day return, weekly and monthly tickets plus up to 50% off Enterprise fares. The free 24+ student railcard is valid for the academic year (September to August).

DayLink – unlimited day travel on Glider and Metro available for 1, 5 or 10 days.
